Live  Well

COVID-19 has affected household finances, earnings, and employment for many people. We know this is causing worry and distress so we have gathered some information about where you can get help.

Live Well

Homes and Housing

Housing welfare support - If you are pension age, severely disabled, live in temporary or supported accommodation, are on a low income or benefits and struggling to pay your bills, you may be able to get help with your housing costs. Visit the benefits page on the North East Lincolnshire Council website or call 0300 3030164 option 3.

Council Tax - If your income has changed or you live alone you may be entitled to a council tax discount. The Council can also review your monthly payments, spread them across 12 months, or arrange a payment holiday. Visit the council tax discount page on the North East Lincolnshire Council website, email counciltax@nelincs.gov.uk. Or call 0300 3030164 option 5.

Homelessness - If your financial situation or health is affecting your ability to manage your tenancy

or housing costs, please contact our housing options team. If you could be made homeless, or already are, it is important you ring us straight away. Call 01472 326296 or visit the homes and property section on the North East Lincolnshire Council website.

Harbour Place is a charity which supports the rough sleepers and homeless people in our area. If you're sleeping rough or think that you might have found someone who is, please call Harbour Place on 01472 355234.

Home Energy and property advice

If you:

- live in a cold home or are struggling to heat your home
- are on a low income
- have inadequate heating and insulation in your property
- need advice about switching gas or electric companies

- are an older or vulnerable person, have a long-term physical or mental health condition or a child under five

- live in a rented home and your landlord has failed to make repairs

- live in a shared house and want information on the responsibilities and duties of landlords

Living costs and debt
